### This funding will be used to:

- Remove the barriers that prevent students from engaging regularly at school through the development of The PLACE.
- To initiate recovery programs – academic, social-emotional wellbeing and behavioural.
- To build College staff capacity and capability to implement the College wide CARF with a focus on implementing the Inclusion Framework.
- To build College staff capacity and capability to implement a College wide framework for recognising the impact of and supporting student's mental health.
- Continue improvement of the A-E achievements of all students with a focus on English and increasing the relative gain of students in NAPLAN.
- Continue to implement a student case management program.

### Our initiatives include:


- Using a continuous process in focus areas to assist students' current performance, teaching to the needs of the students and monitoring improvement. Tracking and monitoring overall student progress in years 7-12. Strengthening the case management approach and providing targeted intervention and support to students at risk of not obtaining a C (Years 7-12 in with a focus on English) and QCE (Years 11/12).
- Providing upskilling for all College staff in mental health first aid to support our students, to increase engagement and to remove barriers that prevent students from attending in person or online.
- Implementing the a space know as the PLACE which focuses on removing the barriers that inhibit students from engaging in the classroom with an outcoming being a renewed student focus on curriculum and academic recovery.
- Providing mentorship to at risk students through the RAISE program. This program connects students, business people and local residents with a focus on providing role models for students who are at risk of disengaging from school in Year 8 and 9.
- Provide all teaching staff with the opportunity to participate in Student Focus Days to build a holistic approach to student case management and engagement with the curriculum though a learning and teaching coach and engaging with the Regional Learning and Teaching Team.
